WHO IS SHE?




Maria Fernanda Tovar, also known as Marifer, is a 20-year old international student at Brookhaven College–currently completing her fourth semester.


Bears Against AIDS 2018-2019

While these positions may seem like a lot on top of her academics, she manages her time well and is constantly seeking new opportunities to further her leadership skills and knowledge.

Each time I work or chat with her during quiet times in our office, I always learn something new about her and find myself constantly amazed. I realize it's students like her that make all the extra time I spend as an advisor to PTK worth every minute. When we travel as team, she's one of the main ones that makes me laugh. Even when she's tired, she still finds the energy to smile and try to brighten someone's day.

In the time that I have known her, it has been my privilege to watch how much she has grown as an individual and a leader. She has vision and purpose; and I feel that if she is given the opportunity, she will go far and really make an impact wherever she goes. She has demonstrated time and again her initiative and commitment to furthering her academic and on-campus experiences.
