

To wait for students to come to us wasn't going to get us to our ultimate goal of giving our students the ability to piece together a better tomorrow. We went out every week to one of our four primary campuses and walked around asking students if they were registered to vote. Many were surprised when they found out that they needed to register to vote. By actively using the skills that we acquired from becoming VDRs we were able to register over 220 students to vote.

The next step was to become trained to work the election polls. Working the election polls was important to us for a few reasons:

- 1) we wanted our students to be able to have the option to go to a polling location where they would know someone, as well as provide them with somewhere they would feel comfortable to ask questions.
- 2) We wanted to not only lead by example for our students, but also to the youth of Collin County. many parents walked in with their kids. We wanted to be there to inspire the next generation to get involved and to show the importance of getting involved in your community.

Intimidated and scared he kept saying "I cant vote ok no worries" Assistant Election Judge and President Sanchez saw this and immediately dropped what he was doing and ran after him. President Sanchez who is bilingual in English and Spanish spoke with the man and explained to him the situation the man came back an hour latter with his mail in ballot which he surrendered and voted in person.
