Our SGA members helped to serve food to the people of the community who came to the event. We also assisted in cleaning up after the event.

We participated in Martin Luther King service theme by volunteering together with Brookhaven and some other community colleges to serve meals at various nursing homes on January 21st. Additionally, we partnered with other student organizations on our campus on February 1st to volunteered at Hope Supply Co. Hope supply Co. is an organization that supplies quality recreations to needy children with diapers, hygiene, school uniform, toys, and clothes. We were glad to help packed almost one thousand baby diapers. We also helped to folded and packed clothes like pants, tops, socks, overalls, and bibs for children of all age groups. This year we hosted rock the vote together with League of women voters on October 4th to 9th. We used rock the vote to reach out to our student in order to get registered to vote, be aware of the upcoming elections, and answer all the questions concerning the election. We used rock the vote to inform and educate our students about the importance of voting. We had a great result at the end of the event.

We also present and represent all our students in every administrative meeting like president cabinet luncheon, Annual Dallas luncheon, and president luncheon which keep us engaged and more effective by telling our administrators our needs.

We also participated in hosting Beto O'Rourke where he came to address our student and some community member about importance of voting and the reason why they should vote. We also did student forum on October 18th. We made our student two sessions one at 1:30pm and another one at 5:30pm so that student who was on able to attend the first session can attend the second session. 
